

ROUTE 8

Departure : Les Moulineaux (T2).

Cross the Pont de Billancourt and turn right in the Avenue Jean Monnet which leads to the Parc départemental de *l'Île St Germain* (Tower with Figures). Turn left and pass on the Pont d'Issy. Turn right in the Rue des Peupliers. Turn right in the Rue des Enfants du Paradis and the Rue de l'Arroseur arrosé.

Turn left in the Avenue du Jour se lève which is along the Bd Périphérique. Turn right in the Avenue George Lafont. Arrive at the Place de la Porte de St Cloud. Turn right in the Rue Godin and on left in the Rue Le Marois (*Beautiful restaurant display*). Cross the Avenue de Versailles (Place Paul Reynaud). Continue in the Rue Boileau. Turn left in the Rue Parent de Rosan.

On left , *Villa Emile Meyer*. Turn right in the *Villa Dietz Monin (Villa Mulhouse*, House build in 1890 by factory workers). At the end of the Villa , *Villa Cheysson*. Turn right and walk along the *Eglise Tous les Saints de la terre Russe*. Turn left in the Rue Boileau and walk along the Bd Exelmans (*Guimard building*).

Turn left in the Rue Chardon Lagache (*Station style Guimard*). At the crossroad , on right , *Villa de la Reunion* and on left *Villa Molitor*. Turn left in the Rue Jouvenet then on right in the Rue Boileau. On left , *Hameau Boileau* (Neo classical houses , build in 1838 to replace the old house of Nicolas Boileau).

Make a roundtrip on left in the Rue Molitor to see the *Villa Boileau*. Continue in the Rue Pierre Guérin. Make a roundtrip in the Avenue Mozart to see the *Villa Flore* (Made by Guimard). Turn right in the Rue La Fontaine. *Guimard building* on left then *Marcel Proust display* and beautiful building at the crossroad. On right , *Rue Agar* with a display style Guimard.

At the crossroad , *Café Guimard*. On left , *Hameau Béranger* and *Castel Béranger* (Guimard). Enter on right in the *Square du pré aux chevaux* and take the Rue Gros on left. Walk on the Pont de Grenelle. On right , at the end of the island , the *small statue of the liberty* (Gift from the United States thanks to Bartholdi which offered them a statue of the liberty).

Turn left in the *Allée des cygnes* (Dam of the beginning of the 19th century). Turn right on the Pont Bir-Hakeim. Turn left in the *Quai Branly* (Square dating of 1941). Turn right in the *Allée Léon Bourgeois* and walk under the *Tour Eiffel* (Built in 1889 for the universal exposition) (Chimney on right). Walk along the *Quai Branly* (Port de la Bourdonnais).

Turn left on the *Passerelle Debilly*. In front of it , *Palais de Tokyo* and *Palais Galliéra*. Walk along the Seine by the *Port Debilly*. Arrive at the *Pont de l'Alma* (Flame and statue). Enter in the *Port de la Conférence* (Departure of Bateaux Mouches) then in the *Port des Champs Elysées*.

Go upstairs to arrive on the *Place de la Concorde* (Old Place de la Révolution where was beheaded Louis XVI , *Chevaux de Marly*).

Turn around it by the right side and enter in the *Jardin des Tuileries* (built by Lenôtre in 1666) , Orangery and Maison du Jeu de Paume , several statues around the octagonal pool). pass below the *Arc de Triomphe du Louvre*. Walk along the *Louvre* (Old house of French Kings , built in 1190 by Philippe Auguste and became a museum in 1793).

Enter in the *Cour Carrée du Louvre*. Get out of it by the right side and walk on the *Pont des Arts* (Footbridge). in front of it , *Institut de France* (Academicians). Walk along the quay on left , sellers of books. On right , *Musée de la Monnaie*. Turn left on the *Pont Neuf* (Oldest bridge of Paris). Make a roundtrip on left in the *Square du Vert Galant* (Monument of Henri IV).

Turn right in the Rue Henri Robert. Turn right and arrive in the *Place Dauphine* (Built by Henri IV in 1607 in homage to Louis 13th, the building at number 14 is of origin). Turn right in the Rue de Harlay and walk along the *Conciergerie* (220 shops inside of it in 1586) , then the *Palais de Justice* (Ste Chapelle from the 13th century). *Sundial* above the quai des orfèvres. Turn left in the Bd du Palais. *Large clock* on the wall of the palais de justice.

Turn right in the Rue de Lutèce (*Marché aux Fleurs* (Verrières)) and *Métro "Cité" Style Guimard*. Turn right in the Rue de la Cité then on left on the *Parvis de Notre Dame* (Old place of the Hôtel Dieu , cathedral of the 12th century). On left , *Hôtel Dieu*. Continue in the Rue du Cloître de Notre Dame.

At number 10 , *musée Notre Dame*. Turn left in the Rue Massillon then on right in the Rue des Chantres. *Hôtel de Chantre* (dating of the 17th century). At the end of the street , *indication* showing the level of the flood of 1910. On the quay , turn right. At numbers 9-11 , *Old house of Héloïse and Abélard* dating of 1118.

Turn left and pass on the Pont St Louis. Turn left in the Rue du Bellay and walk on the Pont Louis Philippe. Turn left in the Rue de l'Hotel de ville then turn right in the Rue de Brosse. Arrive on the *Place St Gervais* (Eglise St Gervais / St Protais , Name of 2 roman officers injured by Nero). *Elm* where is returned justice.

On left , *Hôtel de Ville* (Old Place de Grève). Turn right in the Rue Francois Miron (*Old houses*). At numbers 11 and 13 , *Half-timbered houses* (dating of Louis XI, Sheets of Elms in the ironwork decorating the windows). At number 17, beautiful display "*au Cheval de Sable*". Walk along the *Hôtel de Beauvais* (Main House of the Abbey of Chaalis).

At number 133 of Rue St Antoine , *Chimeras* and Balconies with ironworks at the 1st floor. Turn right in the small Rue du Prévôt ("*rue Percée* " at the 13th century). At number 5 , *Vaults and handles*. Turn left in the Rue Charlemagne. On left , *Eglise St Paul St Louis* (the only church of jesuits in Paris).

Turn right in the Rue des Jardins St Paul and walk along the *Enclosure of Philippe Auguste* (Visible, dating from 1190). Turn left and enter in the *village St Paul*. Get out by the Rue St Paul on left. Make a roundtrip on left in the *Rue Eginhard* and the *Passage St Paul*. Turn right in the Rue des Lions st Paul. *Turret* at the corner of the street.

Turn left in the Rue du Petit Musc then on right in the Rue de la Ceriseraie until the *Arsenal*. Walk along it until the *Place de la Bastille* (old place of prison and symbolic place of the revolution in 1789).

Turn right in the Bd de la Bastille and turn right in the way to arrive at the *Port de l'Arsenal*. Turn right in the Rue de Bercy and turn left in the *Rue Crémieux* (Beautiful houses and indication about the flood of 1910). Turn left in the Rue de Lyon , then on right in the Avenue Ledru Rollin. Go upstairs on the *Promenade Plantée* (Old railroad between Bastille and the *Petite Ceinture*).

Turn right in the Rue de Rambouillet under the Railroads of the Gare de Lyon. Turn left in the Rue de Bercy which passes under the *Ministère des Finances*. Enter in the *Parc de Bercy* (Old wine warehouses). Pass in front of the *Chais de Bercy* and vines of bercy, the *Maison du Jardinage* and the *Orangerie*.

Walk on the footbridge above the Rue Joseph Kessel then walk along the *Maison du Lac*. Make a roundtrip in the *village de Bercy* (restaurants). Come back on the Rue Joseph Kessel. Walk along the *Notre Dame de la Nativité* church and turn right in the Rue des Fonds Verts.

Continue on the same way to the Rue Taine and turn on the left in the *Rue de la Durance* (The street is separated in 2 parts because of the old wall of Fermiers Généraux). Reach the Boulevard de Reuilly and take it on the right. On the Felix Eboué place (*station style Guimard*) , turn on the left in the Avenue Daumesnil and in the Rue Brahms on the right.

Take the *Promenade Plantée* (Old railroad track) and take it on the right until the *Charles Péguy square* and go downstairs. Turn right in the Rue Rottembourg then on left in the Rue de la Véga then on left in Avenue Daumesnil. Walk below the *Petite Ceinture*. Continue that way until the *Lac Daumesnil*.
